Staff provided a brief update on the FY 13/14 Budget direction received by Council. Committee members asked whether or not there has been independent review of return on investment assumptions regarding the Synthetic Turf Field Project in the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Budget. Analysis completed by the PRCS Director assumes a 10% ROI for the project. Staff responded that this assumption will vary depending on the location of the field which is yet to be determined. Committee member Jordan mentioned two synthetic turf fields with lights in Marin County has a ROI of 10%.

B. Cochran summarized Council-directed changes to the Fiscal Sustainability Options Tool. The largest change applied a 1.5% baseline salary increase in the Five-Year Forecast. An option to add a 2.5% salary increase was added to the list of options in the Employee Compensation and Benefits section of the Options Tool. Some Committee members expressed concern with the 1.5% baseline salary increase assumptions as they did not feel it was a realistic or reasonable approximation of historic inflation increases.
