REQUEST

City Council asked the City Clerk to solicit input from all City Boards and Commission on their satisfaction or dissatisfaction with current reporting and communication between the City Council and the EDA Commission.

RECOMMENDATION

The EDA Commission members should discussion this request for input and if there is a general consensus to forward any recommendations for improving reporting and/or communications with City Council, staff should be directed to communication those recommendations to the City Clerk.

BACKGROUND

My understanding is that the EDA Commission has only communicated its position on specific issues where a majority of the Commission has felt it was appropriate. Thus, historically the EDA Commission has only communicated with Council on an "as needed basis".

Some Boards and/or Commissions give City Council either verbal or written annual reports on their activities but this has not been the practice of the EDAC. As the Economic Development Manager, I am planning on producing and distributing quarterly and annual e-reports beginning July 1, 2014. The Quarterly and Annual e-reports will highlight all of the items that the EDA Commission reviews and takes action on. These e-reports will be made available to the City Councilmember and general public.

FISCAL IMPACT

A budget for this particular outreach program will be included in the Economic Development Budget for 7-1-2014 to 6-30-2015. I plan on bringing the entire 2014-15 ED budget to the EDA Commission for its review and approval at March or April meeting.

SUBJECT: Extension of the Shop Local/Novato Campaign through 6-30-14



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REQUEST

Extend the Shop Local/Novato campaign through June 30, 2014 the end of the City's fiscal year 2013-2014.

RECOMMENDATION

The EDA Commission vote to recommend that the ED Manager explore the possibility of securing an additional \$18,000 within the existing 2013-2014 approved City budget to implement the educational component of the Shop Local campaign and continue the Shop Local/Novato out-reach to businesses and consumers through June 30, 2014.

BACKGROUND

In May 2013 the ED Manager proposed implementing the Shop Local Campaign within the approved fiscal year 2012-13 budget. Working with the City Manager's office we identified funding of approximately \$54,000 that we could use to get the program up and operating from June through September 2013. Unfortunately, the balance of un-paid funds in the 2012-13 budget of approximately \$34,000 did not get carried over and included in the 2013-2014 Economic Development Department's budget.

The combined 2012-13 and 2013-14 budget for the Shop Local campaign was \$132,000 and to date we have incurred expenses of \$100,000.

FISCAL 2014-15

After we review the fourth quarter retail sales figures for 2013 we will determine if the program paid for itself and if so we will recommend and include a line-item budget to extend the Shop Local campaign from July 1, 2014 through to June 30, 2015. MuniServices will receive the 2013 4th Q sales tax information from the Franchise Tax Board and present that data to us in April/May of 2014.

SUBJECT: Proposed Measure F Funds to Advance the City's Economic Growth and

path towards Long-term Fiscal Sustainability

REQUEST

Discuss, identify and recommend allocation of Measure F funds to promote the economic growth and vitality of the City and increase ongoing city revenues.

RECOMMENDATION

Have the EDA Commission discuss and recommend allocation of Measure F funds to attract high paying jobs, growth industries, needed private sector, nonprofit or educational services like retailers who can reduce the City's retail leakage, senior housing and medical services, better educational programs and opportunities to prepare our workforce for the new and growing industry jobs.

Staff's brain storming ideas include: \$350k annually for industry and job recruitment and other private sector recruitment efforts; a revolving fund of \$2 million to help pay the up-front cost of infrastructure that would be paid back to the city over a 3 to 5 year period; a revolving fund of \$5 million to help build or renovate facilities necessary to attract new or retain existing businesses. These funds would also be paid back over a 3 to 5 year period.

BACKGROUND

The City Manager has asked each Department to identify potential uses of Measure F funds to advance and implement the strategic goals that the City Council identified for each department. Attached is a copy of the City Council's Strategic Goals and Objectives for Economic Development.

In Summary they are:

Through the promotion of Novato and our development of programs aimed at the recruitment and retention of high paying jobs, facilitate Novato becoming a key business destination. Facilitate a vibrant and restored downtown and other commercial centers that enhance community spaces, restaurant options, the retail environment, and the City's financial base.

Outcome: The prime business and retail destination in the North Bay with high paying jobs including clean and bio technology sectors, and a down-town and other retail centers bustling with shoppers, event-goers, and employees with a retained small town character and active public spaces.

 - 6. Explore opportunities to improve the image of the City and pride in our community, for example, by establishing an online store. (FY 13/14)



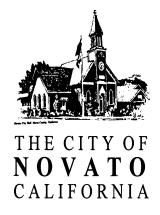

E - 1 North Redwood Corridor Planning Guideline proposals were presented by Bob Brown, Community Development Director

Motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Thomas to recommended the following changes to the proposed design guidelines:

- 1. That 'NO" residential uses be allowed either horizontally or vertically in the area from Olive avenue to Rush Creek Road and Redwood Blvd. to the railroad tracks on the east.
- 2. The size of individual stores should be flexible but not exceed 40,000 sf. and commercial uses on second and third floors should be allowed.

- 3. Redwood Blvd. should remain a four lane road and the City should do a study on possible improvements to the median; and
- 4. Design features of the Dairyman's building should be encouraged but not be made mandatory
