

Committee members present had the following information requests from staff, clarification on the details of the After School Initiative Measure F funding request for Parks and Rec and minor clarification on the difference between the overall increases to the Public Works O & M budget and 922 Machin building O & M Staff will the follow-up information at the next meeting.
- 2. Measure F Program Process (revised from the Feb 27 meeting)
 Staff will present the operating budget to the City Council on April 8^{th} (this is a change from April 1).

At the Feb 27 meeting, the Committee expressed concerns about the Measure F public outreach process. Originally, staff was going to solicit feedback from the community on how they wanted Measure F funds spent. The Committee said initiating this process and then another for a new revenue measure in the future could get confusing. Staff will hold off on the outreach process and it was removed from the process scheduled.
