

H. NEW BUSINESS

1. Consider Assigning Commissioner Liaisons for Proposed Hamilton Fields Sports Complex Private Development Project. Ms. Shinault explained that the Commission is advisor to the Council and vet projects and issues, reviews projects and make valuable recommendations to Council. Ms. Shinault shared some options that the Commission can use, such as a steering committee, an ad hoc committee, and liaisons. The Hamilton Sports Complex project is a private project and is in the early stages of the process. She explained the process the project will possibly go through. There is still time for the Commission to give their input. Currently there have been two studies completed, a Fields Needs Assessment, and an Economic Impact Analysis, which will be shared at a future public meeting. There is still a long way to go with this project.

Commissioner Caye stated that he lives next to the location of the project and offered to help inform and facilitate the information to the Commission. He would like to see a win-win resolution.

The Commission wants to be informed about this. There was discussion as to having liaisons versus an ad hoc committee, eventually agreeing on an ad hoc committee. The ad hoc committee consists of: Commissioners Caye, Neese and Crow. Ms. Shinault will inform the ad hoc committee members of any information, meetings, etc. that occur with this project. It was suggested the committee go to the library and do some research regarding Hamilton's evolution.

The Commission requested that staff come back with a review of the old Community Park Plan and Hamilton Master Plan.

Commissioner Caye stated that if the Commission has to vote on this item, he will need to recuse himself.

I. STAFF REPORTS

- 1. Projects and Programs and Issues Report verbal
 - <u>Hamilton Field Sports Complex</u> verbal update (see item H.1.).
 - Hill Recreation Area Master Plan update. The consultant continues to work on the synthetic turf feasibility analysis study. Staff is talking with the Novato Unified School District to expand and share parking. The City continues to discuss acquiring the Lieb property, possibly for passive uses. Staff hopes to see movement on this project in November. In the current CIP budget, there is funding to do part of the parking, 1 field with synthetic turf and bocce ball courts. There was discussion regarding lighting the synthetic turf field, and the differences between maintenance of a regular turf field versus a synthetic turf field.
 - <u>Dogbone Meadow renovation project update</u>. This facility is very popular and heavily used. Staff will be hiring a landscape architect and look at ADA issues, access, and other issues. It is hoped that the Community Garden will move to the Lieb property, which would be a better location for them.
 - <u>Bahia Mini Parks project update</u>. This project is moving along. Staff continues to meet with the HOA's Parks Committee to plan the renovation of two large parks, one being active and the other being a passive use.
 - <u>Super Bowl 50 Super Communities Involvement</u>. This is the 50th year of the Super Bowl and this year is at Levi Stadium. Novato is a "super community" and was featured on "50" things to do in Novato.
 - <u>ADA Self Evaluation and Transition Plan Approved</u>. Staff will start working on projects through the budget process.
 - <u>City Manager Departure</u>. He will be leaving the end of December. Council will try to decide what to do with that position.

REQUEST

Consider recommending conceptual plans for the improvements of two existing parks at Bahia, CIP Project No. 15-004.

RECOMMENDATION

Recommend approval of conceptual plans for two parks at Bahia.

DISCUSSION AND BACKGROUND

Play equipment was removed from Bahia's mini parks in 2010 due to the age and condition of the structures. There was neither sufficient funding to replace the equipment nor maintenance resources to maintain the same. Staff has worked over the last few years with the neighborhood on various plans and options for providing some measure of park facilities in Bahia.

In 2014, City staff attended an HOA board meeting, where subject to City Council budget approval, the City offered to renovate the one larger park with play equipment, and place some benches in other parks, and work with HOA to reach agreement on the HOA covering the maintenance of the other four parks.

Staff met with the Bahia Park Committee several times since budget adoption, and on November 16, 2015 staff held a public workshop at the Bahia club house and received feedback from the residents of Bahia on the concept plans developed by City staff and the park committee. The plans have been revised to accommodate some of the feedback received at the public workshop. City staff and the public committee would like to move forward with this project including obtaining City Council approval for the design.




The Bahia Mini Parks Improvement project comprises installation of play equipment and other improvements such as benches, picnic tables at one bigger park parcel (APN 143-242-65), and minor park amenities at the smaller park parcel (APN 143-233-29). Construction is anticipated for summer of 2015.


Public notification and outreach included City Staff from Public Works and Parks Recreation Community Services attending a number of Bahia Homeowners Association Board meetings. City project team met with Bahia's Park Committee three times to explore needs, design ideas, and to create and refine the design plans for the two largest public parks in Bahia. The preliminary concept plans were created with the Bahia Parks Committee and then were shared and revised at a public workshop. The public workshop meeting invitation was mailed to all property owners and residents at Bahia and was announced in the HOA's regular newsletter. The public workshop was well attended and great discussion occurred regarding the park amenities. The plans were revised based on the feedback from the workshop and revised and approved by the Bahia Parks Committee at a meeting in December 2015. Funding for the project and the parks improvements was made possible by County Parks Measure A.

<u>Project Objective:</u> To reinstall play equipment and other improvements at one park parcel, and minor park amenities at up to five other mini park sites within the Bahia neighborhood.

Project Description and Background: Play equipment was removed from Bahia's mini parks in 2010 due to the age and condition of the stuctures. There was neither sufficient funding to replace the equipment nor maintenance resources to maintain the same. Staff has worked over the last few years with the neighborhood on various plans and options for providing some measure of park facilities in Bahia. The project would reinstall playground equipment at the largest park site within Bahia (Parcel C, across from Andale Avenue), and reinstall minor amenities, such as benches at some of the other sites.

Basis for Cost Estimate: Costs are based on estimates included in the December 2013 Novato Parks Facility Assessment and Maintenance Analysis.

Basis for Schedule: This project should be implemented and completed in FY 14/15.

Revenue Considerations: Marin County Measure A Parks Sales Tax is the funding source.

RECOMMENDATION


Approve Nomination of the Novato Historical Guild.

DISCUSSION

The CPRS District 1 Annual Community Service Award recognizes outstanding contribution by an individual or group to a California Park and Recreation Society (CPRS) District 1 agency and community either by volunteering or making a donation that assisted in "Creating Community Through People, Parks and Programs."

Each year, Novato Parks, Recreation and Community Services (PRCS) Department works with hundreds of volunteers. Their commitment to serving the community, and partnering with the City in their volunteer efforts, allows us to be able to provide a wide breadth and scope of programs and facilities for the public. Each agency within CPRS District 1 selects a candidate or organization to receive the Community Service award in recognition and honor of their work in that community. District 1 is our local chapter of the statewide CPRS professional organization, and hosts an awards banquet and dinner to showcase the work and dedication of our exceptional volunteers

This year we recommend that the Novato Historical Guild receive the CPRS District 1 Community Service Award from Novato for their dedication and service to the community in preserving local history and partnering with the City to manage and operate our two City Museums through a volunteer workforce. One of the City's budget cuts beginning in 2009/10 was to eliminate the staff position of Museum Coordinator. The Novato Historical Guild stepped up to fill the gap, and continue our excellent Museum programs without staff support. The City has had a long term partnership with the Guild, and they continue to impress with their

dedication to working collaboratively with the City to keep the Museums as a vital link to Novato's past.

The Novato History Museum was originally founded in 1976 by the Guild for the City, and it has been operating since that time. The Hamilton Field History Museum was opened for public use in 2010. Both Museums benefit financially from Guild support for exhibits and program costs.

The Guild recruits, trains and supervises volunteers to maintain and manage the City owned collections, and to provide open public hours at both Museums. All volunteers are signed up as City volunteers. The Guild coordinates and provides a Third Grade Tour program each year for all of the third grade classes in Novato schools so that Novato school children have an appreciation of their local history, and a better sense of place in the community.

In 2014/15, the Guild's 95 active volunteers provided 6,293 of service hours in support of the two Museums. In addition to that – they assisted more than 3,500 visitors at the Museums.

We feel that the Novato Historical Guild is a very deserving organization to receive a CPRS Community Service Award. This group is a truly amazing example of hard work and a long standing, and successful partnership with PRCS in "Creating Community Through People, Parks and Programs." Their dedication to the Novato community, and to the preservation of local history, contributes greatly to making Novato a great place to live, work, and play.
