D. PUBLIC COMMENTS

a. Kevin Morrison: wanted to send well-wishes to commissioners whose terms were expiring.

E. GENERAL BUSINESS

- 1. Development Update Bob Brown, Community Development Director
 - a. Hamilton
 - i. Hamilton Cottages construction underway
 - ii. Hamilton Villages framing to begin soon
 - iii. Old Gas Station soil remediation continuing no approved plan for redeveloping the site
 - b. Major projects

- 1. Residence inn to Planning Commission 9/17 and Council in October
- 2. Hanna Ranch to Planning Commission 9/17 and Council in October
- 3. First & Grant application almost complete, will go to Planning Commission once complete
- 4. Large set of plans received this week from Target @ Vintage Oaks
 - a. Target doing \$2.4M renovation
- 5. Interest in Birkenstock continues
- 6. Sports Basement seems to be doing well it will take awhile for them to show up on sales tax reporting
- 7. Ex-Officio Barry asked about parking on 1st & Grant
 - a. Got pulled and Council never took back up likely will go to 9/11
 - b. Neighborhood behind project concerned about spillover parking
 - c. We have done analysis and results are positive, supporting ability to grant waiver for commercial parking component for 1st & Grant
 - d. Public Works identified 50 additional spots on Front/First becomes a maintenance item for Public Works
- 8. Kevin Morrison said it would be great if that information got out to the neighbors staff will let Public Works know
- 9. Commissioner Smith DeBorbas notice re: Design Review Commission; ADA access will come up to code, extensive building modification, so not deemed historic. They can modify but they'll honor historical architecture 9/5
- 10. Ex-Officio Howard Fireman's Fund, Hangar 8, General Plan
 - a. GP hearings planned for March/April
 - b. Why did it get delayed? EIR
 - c. Will it come to EDAC again?
 - i. Yes, in spring, you'll see EIR before Council
 - d. No updates on Fireman's Fund, Hanger 8
- 2. Cannabis City Regulations Update David McPherson, Hdl Companies
 - a. Overview
 - i. Council in Fall
 - ii. City currently has moratorium until November, community outreach/survey/workshops have been fruitful to date (nine total public meetings touching on different things)
 - iii. Mr. Morrison commented that survey was thorough and best survey City has ever done
 - iv. Commissioner Howard asked if we are hearing from specific demographics? TH
 - 1. Staff shared preliminary results on Open Novato survey
 - v. Michael Antwine, ACM, tasked with it
 - 1. Business license component
 - 2. Tax component will require voter approval
 - vi. San Rafael has 6% tax, American Canyon, Napa, Benicia, Martinez, Vallejo, Marin County (at a halt), rest mostly dry at this time/discussion

occurring, Fairfax, Cotati has 1, high volume, Cloverdale has 4 anticipating 12, Sonoma, Sebastopol, Santa Rosa

b. Outreach

- i. Education, then ordinances and regulation
- ii. Core values/priorities are public safety, environmental protection, neighborhood and land use protection and access by youth
- Types of opportunities cultivation, microbusiness, manufacturing, testing labs, delivery/non-store front retailer, retail medicinal/adult-use, distribution facilities
- iv. Application criteria proposed location, qualifications of principals, business plan, security plan, local enterprise, enhanced product safety, neighborhood compatibility, community benefits, labor & employment (k-12 schools, commercial day cares and youth facilities part of state law buffer requirements)
- v. Commissioner Thomas asked about State involvement
 - 1. Will require local and state components state checks for backgrounds of operators but it takes several months

c. Retail

- Benefits of retail in downtown foot traffic, brings people downtown, fills vacant spaces, new sources of revenue for city, creates confidence as cannabis businesses normalize to the community
- ii. You cannot consume on-site or on-street
- iii. Parking turnover customers are not typically in the store more than 20 minutes
- iv. Banking cannot hold money made via marijuana in a federal bank
- v. Sales footprint is about 1000/sqft
- vi. California's market share is 49%, next closest is Colorado with 30%

d. Potential Taxes and fees

- i. Application fee
- ii. Annual regulatory fee
- iii. Cannabis tax
- iv. Sales tax
- v. Taxes need to be balanced
