

H. NEW BUSINESS

1. Novato Age Friendly Project Request for Co-sponsorship and Public Art Fund Support.

Recreation Services Manager Liz Tran asked Commission to consider, and possibly take action to recommend Parks, Recreation, & Community Services (PRCS) co-sponsorship of the Age Friendly Novato mural project and an allocation of \$5,000 from the Art in Public Places fund to cover the cost of materials. Gloria Dunn-Violin, and artist Laurie Marshall presented the Age Friendly Novato Mural Project including its goals, progress and scope of work. This project brings together a diverse, multi-generational group of residents to design, paint and celebrate the values of Novato. A video was shown. Commissioners were able to see a sketch of the project. When completed, this mural will be displayed at the Margaret Todd Senior Center, but also able to move to different locations.

Commissioner Crow asked what the funds would be used for. Ms. Dunn-Violin answered that it would be used for materials, professional artists, a Spanish translator and other supplies for the project.

2. Multicultural Advisory Commission Merger Discussion.

Ms. Tran asked Commission to discuss and provide a recommendation to staff regarding a proposal to merge the Multicultural Advisory Commission (MAC) with the Recreation, Cultural, & Community Services (RCCS) Commission.

During Public Comment, Multicultural Advisory Commissioner Jennifer Burt spoke in favor of keeping the commission separate from the Recreation, Cultural and Community Services Commission.

The RCCS Commission came to a consensus to not make a formal decision without gathering more information.

I. REPORTS/INFORMATION

1. <u>Director's Report.</u> Recreation Services Manager Kevin Conklin shared that the Fall Activity Guide has been released. We were able to add color throughout and plan to have three Guides per year. Recreation Coordinator Mark Ricossa will be retiring after 21 years running the Lu Sutton Childcare program. An open recruitment is underway to fill his position. Two staff members are expecting their first baby in the coming months. We are planning a 20th Anniversary for the Novato Gymnastics Center next year. We are still looking to fill a Gymnastics Instructor position.

2. <u>CIP Project Updates</u>. Ms. Tran gave a CIP Projects Update.

- **Dogbone Meadows:** Sod was recently installed. There is a tentative reopening ceremony planned for November 3. Commissioners will receive an invitation via email.
- Hill Master Plan: Gates & Associates has been hired to develop the construction documents for the Central Hub Project.
- Community Garden: Staff met with Ganda, an Archeological Research Consultant, today to seek expertise with cultural sensitivities of the site. Novato Live Well is continuing their outreach and fundraising efforts.
 - i. Chair Weber asked about the status of the plan for the rest of Lieb property. Assistant City Manager Michael Antwine answered that the site plan will be part of the 19/20 budget process.

3. Upcoming City Council Items.

- a) October 30 Age Friendly Novato mural project funding and cosponsorship, as approved earlier in the meeting.
- b) October 30 Naming of the gentle play area at Dogbone Meadow Dog Park as "Brian's Place".
- c) October 30 Proposed improvement project to the Downtown Recreation Center, as funded by a housing related park grant though the state.

J. COMMISSION REPORTS/COMMENTS.

1. <u>Commission Comments/Reports</u>. Commissioner Crow applauded the organization and the attention to detail of the Summer Concert Series and hopes there will be more held at the Hamilton Amphitheater Park.

Commissioner Pouteau shared that he has met with Chair Weber and the Chamber of Commerce to discuss cross-promotion opportunities. The Chamber is hosting their monthly mixer at the Novato History Museum on October 18 from 5:30-7PM featuring Novato Parks and Recreation. There was also discussion that when the Central Hub is built, the Chamber may be able to help find sponsors for the various courts.

Commissioner Crow asked the status of the board appointments. Manager Conklin shared that it is postponed until Council makes a decision on the potential merger of the RCCS Commission and MAC.

Commissioner Bentley shared information about the upcoming North Bay Discovery Day in Santa Rosa.
