Maintenance Plan . . .

Schedule for Maintenance

Every Six Months:

- ☐ Replace batteries for flashlight, radio, etc.
- ☐ Review family drills (i.e., earthquake, fire, and evacuation drills) including memorizing contact numbers.

Every Year:

- □ Rotate canned goods.
- ☐ Rotate water supply.
- □ Update school release forms.
- □ Replace emergency medications.
- ☐ Review the "Disaster Plan Worksheet."

Every Two Years:

- □ Update personal property inventory.
- □ Update insurance policies.

Every Three Years:

☐ Replace freeze dried foods and non-fat dry milk.

Crime Prevention

- ☐ Report anything suspicious to your local Police Department.
- ☐ Do not leave valuables in your car and keep doors locked at all times.
- ☐ Activate your home and car alarms when unattend-
- ☐ Shred all personal information and important documents when discarding.
- ☐ Check your credit reports annually from all three credit bureaus.
- ☐ Make a copy of everything in your wallet in case your wallet is stolen.
- ☐ Keep itemized lists of personal property with serial numbers in case of loss.
