










TYPES OF FORCE

All of the use of forces were reviewed by the employees supervisor and Command Staff.
While training issues were identified in some of the uses of force, all were found to be lawful and within department policy.

*Please Note: that one use of force incident may include more than one type of force-For example, an incident may include a takedown and an impact strike.



In 2022, The Novato Police department initiated and/or responded to 36,219 calls for service or events. Most of these events involved a uniformed officer interacting with one or more people.


What is a Housing Element?

The Housing Element is a required section of the City's General Plan. It must:

- Assess the residents' housing needs and conditions of housing stock
- Establish a roadmap for accommodating projected housing unit demand over the next eight years
- Set citywide housing-related goals, objectives, policies, and programs
- Show how the City can accommodate housing at all income levels

Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA)

- A jurisdiction's RHNA is the amount of housing each city must plan for in the Housing Element
- Novato's RHNA for the upcoming planning period (2023-2031) is 2,090 units
- Cities are not required to build or initiate housing projects, but rather ensure zoning capacity exists to build

DOWNTOWN NOVATO BUSINESS/PROPERTY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM GRANT

The City of Novato is now accepting applications for the 2nd round of the Downtown Business/Property Improvement Program Grant. This program offers downtown Novato property and business owners matching grant reimbursements for permanent improvements to commercial buildings downtown.

Eligible projects may include:

- Restoration of historical façade features
- Permanent awnings/canopies
- Hazardous materials abatement
- Exterior lighting
- Compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act





SUMMARY

Proposed FY2021/22 staffing at 190.5 Full-Time Equivalents (FTE) remains 43.5 FTE lower than the 20-year high of 234 FTE in FY2002/03. Current FTE levels have not been this low since the recession and subsequent elimination of Redevelopment Agencies in FY2011/12; at that time the total authorized FTE was 182.27 employees.






