BUDGET STRATEGY

CITY MANAGER'S PROPOSED BUDGET – FY 12/13

- Recovery and Measure F provides opportunity to maintain service levels and begin to stabilize the organization
 - No staff reductions or reductions in programs or services
 - No use of general reserves which is maintained at 15%
- Strategically targets resources to support Council's Strategic Plan initiatives
- Utilizes Measure F revenues sparingly
- Goal was to fashion a budget that is sustainable in the long-term; restoration of some expenses ongoing while other additions are limited term in nature to provide flexibility

CITY MANAGER KEY RECOMMENDATIONS

■Expand Neighborhood Safety and Quality of Life — "Neighborhood Response Team"

- Measure F priority funding -- "neighborhood police patrols and crime prevention programs."
- Federal COPS grant funding for 3 Police Officer positions for 3 years; City commits to pay 4th year; upgrade 1 Police Officer to Corporal; add Program Coordinator for 2 years
- Build an interdepartmental and inter-disciplinary team

Recreate Economic Development with elimination of redevelopment

- Add Economic Development Manager; 1.0 FTE
- Add Hamilton City Property Revitalization Manager; 0.5 FTE

•Utilize Measure F sparingly until broader plan developed

 Funding for Neighborhood Response Team, Economic Development Manager, and

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- Part-time Hamilton position
- After School Initiative as a Pilot Program
- Preserve and protect two positions on a temporary basis (1.0 Maintenage Worker,
 - 1.0 Senior Admin Clerk as Receptionist, Intern for Public Works),

OPERATING BUDGET – GENERAL FUND FY 12/13

Revenues projected to increase to \$28.5M

- Property tax projected to increase slightly; sales tax continues to improve at a higher pace and is estimated to increase 4.7%
- Revenues include reimbursements for grant-funded positions

Expenditures have been increased to \$30.7M

- Includes vacancy factor of \$400,000
- Key Staffing Impacts to the General Fund include:
 - For FY 12/13, the General Fund has absorbed \$115K in payroll costs from the dissolved Redevelopment Agency
 - Shifts Senior Planner to General Fund from General Plan Fund
 - Includes \$570K in grant-funded positions in Police and PRCS including Measure F additions for Neighborhood Team

"Transfers In" will add \$1.5M for Total Financing Available of \$30.0 million

KEY MESSAGES

Recession Impacts and Uncertainty Continue

- Economy beginning to recover; sales tax is growing slowly
- Yet still uncertainty in international markets

FY 12/13 Budget – One Step Forward, Two Steps Back

- Staff has completed the implementation of years of budget and staff reductions to realign the organization with 50 less employees and 20% less resources
- Yet loss of redevelopment funding impacts General Fund by \$800K ongoing and requires General Fund support for any economic development program

Structural Deficit Remains — Developing a Road Map towards Fiscal Sustainability

- Significant progress made on structural deficit
- Structural deficit continues with \$0.6 M projected in FY 12/13 and growing to \$2.2 M projected in FY 16/17
- Use Measure F funds cautiously for FY 12/13 (until long term plan determined)
 - Back fill any structural deficit for FY 12/13 (\$0.6 M)
- Fiscal sustainability discussion this summer/fall with Measure F Oversight Committee and the Council to develop a road map with a multi-year strategy
